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The registrar shall pay the contributions received 36 pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 37 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 38 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 39 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 40 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 41 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 42 other abortion-related activities. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society.
